



Speech Marks



We add speech marks for things someone tells.

e.g: "The fireworks are brilliant!" said Ben.

What did Ben say? Note the underlined section.

Here is another way to write,

e.g: Ben said, "The fireworks are brilliant!"

Note the use of commas and other punctuation marks inside the speech marks.

Add speech marks to the spoken words.
