Writing a Recount

Yesterday, we read a story about something that two boys die (bug hunting). Today we will write a story of something you really did. This kind of writing is called a *recount*. Here are some rules for writing a recount.

- Write your recount in the first person (using *I* and *me*) because it happened to you! Eg "I felt excited."
- Use the past tense because it has already happened. Eg "It was the biggest fish I had ever seen!"
- Recounts are written in the order in which they happened. This is called chronological order.
- You might use adverbs such as: *firstly*, *next*, *then* and *finally*.
- Using descriptive words will make it seem like your reader is there with you. Eg "The fish was shiny and slippery." Focus on the most exciting parts.
