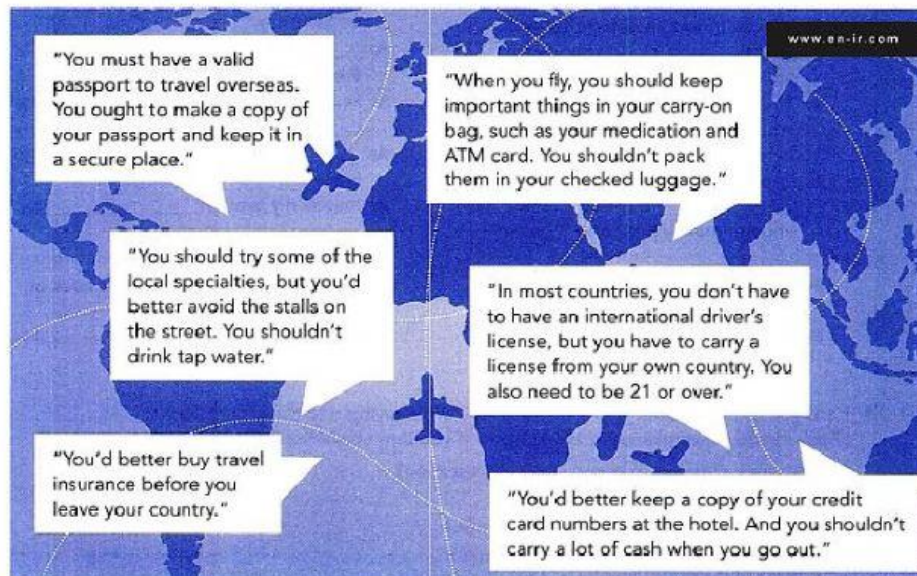
The best way to remember new phrasal verbs is to learn them in context rather than memorising a long list with definitions. It is important to practise using phrasal verbs in context as much as possible.
