PRESENT PERFECT WITH ALREADY AND YET

In the Present Perfect tense, we use already with affirmative sentences and yet with questions or negative sentences.

Affirmative

I have *already* seen Avatar 2.

She has already left for school.

They have *already* read this book.

Negative

I haven't been to the Prado museum yet.

We haven't found the treasure yet.

He hasn't shown his grades to his parents yet.

Questions

Have you done your homework yet?

Yes, I have already done my homework.

Have you handed in your English review yet?

Yes, I have already handed it in.

Has he washed the car yet?

No, he hasn't washed the car yet.

Have they finished painting the baby's room yet?

No, they haven't finished painting it yet.

As you can see, yet ALWAYS goes at the end of the sentence (or the question).

And already goes between the have/has and the past participle (just like just).
