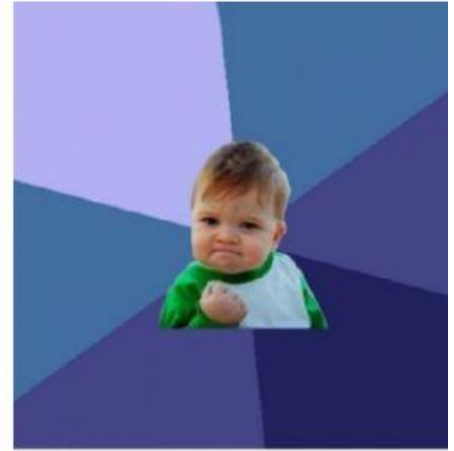


Would you like to be a meme?
