hiking and do some fishing.

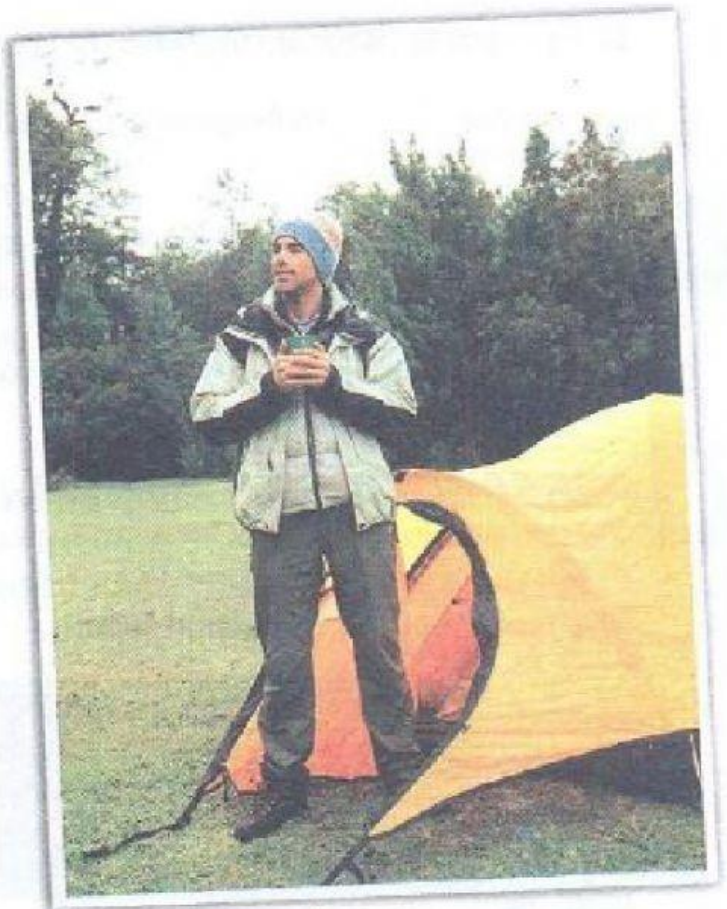
A: you rent a camper?
