

Linking Verbs

RULES

An **action verb** tells what the subject does or did.

A **linking verb** links the subject of a sentence to a noun or an adjective in the predicate.

A linking verb does not express action.

Spiders are interesting creatures.

Forms of the verb be are often used as linking verbs.

am	was
is	were
are
