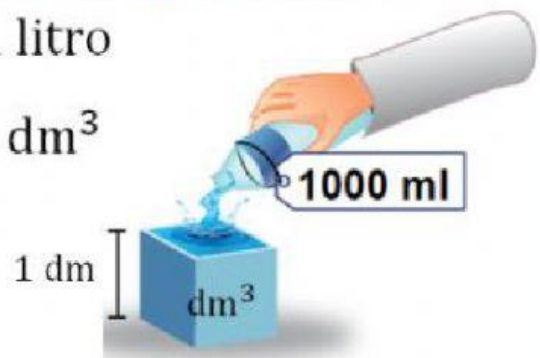
Unidades de volumen y de capacidad

$$1\ 000\ \text{ml} = 1\ \text{litro}$$

$$1\ \text{litro} = 1\ \text{dm}^3$$

$$1\ \text{dm} = 0.1\ \text{m}$$

$$1\ \text{dm} = 10\ \text{cm}$$
