

## WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

### SEE

- When an image comes to your eyes (without intent).
- "She opened the door and **saw** me standing there."

### LOOK

- To see something with intent and attention (often used with the preposition AT).
- "Susan **looked** at the menu before ordering his meal."



### WATCH

- To look intensely at something (often something that is moving).
- We **watched** the plane take off."

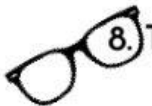
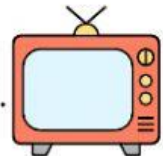
