- The number of inhabitants/people per square kilometer
- The physical expansion of cities
- The land on which a settlement is built. The landforms of the area (the specific place) on which it has developed
- A building in which missionary (religious & social) work is performed
- Composed of people (or ethnicities) from all parts of the world
- A characteristic of a metropolis, city or region where people of diverse cultures live.
- The values, traditions, customs & way of life for a group of people
