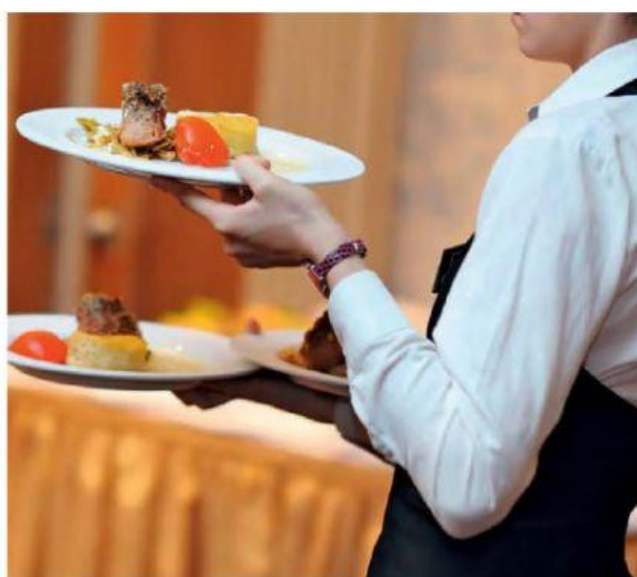

## The American diner

The American diner is a great place to eat, but it's strange for foreigners. When you sit down, someone brings you a glass of ice water. You don't <sup>1</sup> order the water – it just comes. The <sup>2</sup> menu is not a simple list of food. It's a long list with hundreds of <sup>3</sup> choices. A <sup>4</sup> waiter in a diner can cook anything and everything! Luckily, there are often pictures of some of the <sup>5</sup> items in the <sup>6</sup> menu to help you choose. When you <sup>7</sup> order a simple sandwich, the <sup>8</sup> waiter asks you lots of questions – what sort of bread, if you want cheese on it, etc. He writes all the information down and gives it to the <sup>9</sup> chef. At the end of the meal, you ask for the <sup>10</sup> bill. Usually, you leave the money on the table with the <sup>11</sup> tip and you leave a <sup>12</sup> percentage of 15–20 percent. It's important to leave a <sup>13</sup> tip – in the USA, a <sup>14</sup> waiter doesn't get much money!
