DEFINITION OF CAUSE AND EFFECT

"Cause and effect" is a relationship between events or things, where one is the result of the other or others.

A cause is a catalyst, a motive, or an action that brings about a reaction—or reactions. A cause instigates an effect.

An effect is a condition, occurrence, or result generated by one or more causes. Effects are outcomes.

A cause is why something happens. An effect is what happened.

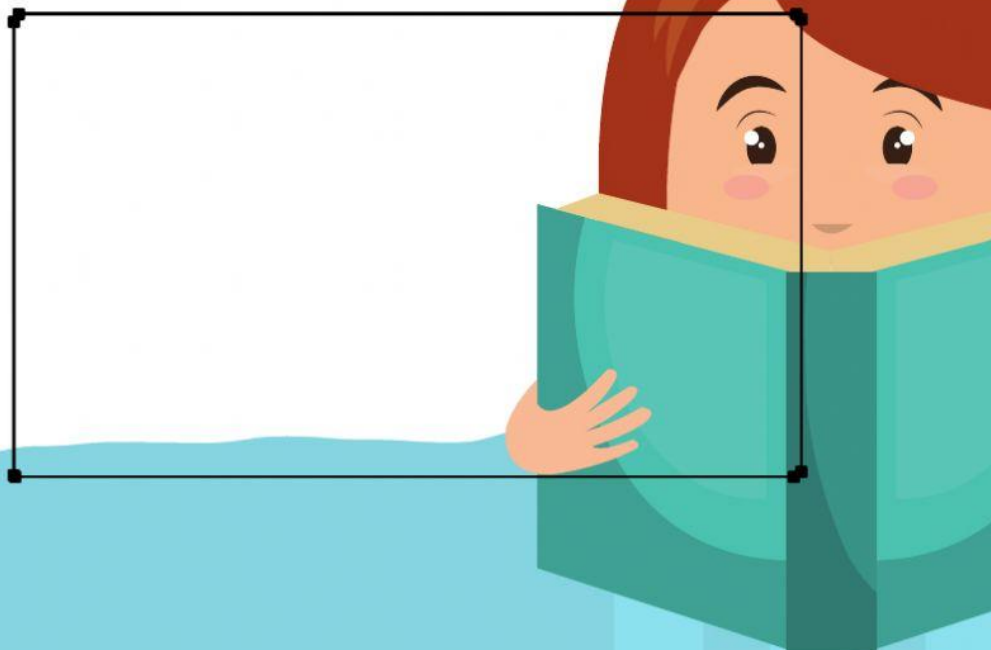
For example:

you have a picnic planned for Sunday afternoon. However, the weather becomes stormy and you have to cancel your outdoor plans. In this situation, the cause is the stormy weather and the effect of that stormy weather is the picnic cancellation.

- I ate tons of junk food. so now I feel sick.
Cause effect
- I feel sick because I ate tons of junk food.
Effect cause
