<p>The sentence We use it in affirmative statements. It goes between the auxiliary verb and the perfect participle form.</p> <p>Examples: <i>I have already sent you a message. Mary has already baked a cake.</i></p>	<p>The sentence We use it in interrogative and negative sentences. It goes at the end of the sentence.</p> <p>Examples: <i>Have you seen it yet? Kevin hasn't eaten any cheese yet.</i></p>
