## Linking rule 4: T, D, S, or Z + Y

**t + y = /tʃ/**

Can't **ty**ou do it?

What's **ty**our name?

Don't **ty**ou like it?

Wouldn't **ty**ou?

Haven't **ty**ou? No, not **ty**et.

I'll let **ty**ou know.

Can I get **ty**ou a drink?

We thought **ty**ou weren't coming.

I'll bet **ty**ou ten bucks he forgot.

Is that **ty**our final answer?

**d + y = /dʒ/**

Did **dy**ou see it?

How did **dy**ou like it?

Could **dy**ou tell?

Where did **dy**ou send **dy**our check?

What did **dy**our family think?

Did you find **dy**our keys?

We followed **dy**our instructions.

**s + y = /ʃ/**

Bless **ssy**ou!

Yes, **sy**ou are.

Press **ssy**our hands together.

Can you dress **ssy**ourself?

You can pass **ssy**our exams this **sy**ear.

I'll try to guess **ssy**our age.

Let him gas **sy**our car for you.
