

Concept	Definition
Intonation	This is the movement of the level of the voice. E.G. the tune of a sentence or a group of words
Appropriacy	To decide how a speaker feels about something from the way that they speak
Connected Speech	Using gestures and expressions to reinforce what we say with words
Accuracy	Using a level of formality when we are speaking or writing which suits the situation and audience.
Fluency	This is two way to communication using language and body language to keep our listener involved in what we are saying and to check that they understand what we mean.
Body Language	Using the correct form of the language, in the other words, not making any grammatical or phonological mistakes.
Interaction	Spoken language in which words are joined to form a connected stream of features include: contractions, linkage, vowel, shortening in unstressed words, dropped sounds.
Inference	The ability to speak confidently at a normal speed without overuse of thinking pauses, hesitation devices and false starts
