

1 Prepositions of place

- Use **on** with the names of streets and avenues: The bookstore is **on** Center Street.
The theater is **on** Park Avenue.
- **Across from** is another way of saying *opposite*: The library is **across from** the theater.
= The library is **opposite** the theater.
