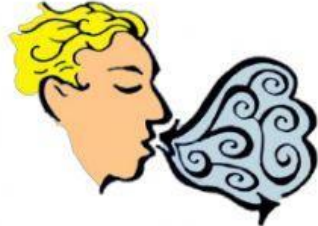


Emergency Services
