

Natural Disasters (Hurricane)

Read the passage carefully.

A hurricane is a huge storm that forms over the ocean. Hurricanes usually last for over a week, gaining strength as they travel over the warm water. When they hit land, they bring strong rain and winds. Hurricanes can damage buildings and trees. They can cause flooding as well. Most hurricanes occur during Fall months since they are formed in warmer waters. The season officially starts on June 1 and ends on November 30. Two of the worst hurricanes that hit Jamaica were hurricane Charlie in 1951 and hurricane Gilbert in 1988. If a hurricane is coming, it is best to leave the area and go to a safer location. You must stay inside during a hurricane.
