Personal pronouns	Possessive adjectives	Example.
I	my	My name's James Taylor.
you	your	How old is your car?
he	his	His address is 16 Leyton Road.
she	her	What's her telephone number?
it	its	The horse hurt its leg.
we	our	Our son is six years old.
they	their	What's their email address?
