



Last month, I went on a trip to Humahuaca, a city with 11,000 inhabitants in the Humahuaca valley, Jujuy. Humahuaca is interesting because it has two very different areas. The city's centre contains the municipal buildings, shops, and market stalls. Not far from the centre is a quiet area of little streets and houses. When you visit, you should try to see both of them.

First of all, you should visit the beautiful 17th-century church, just by the main square. The church is very small, but it is actually a cathedral! Then you should climb the steps to the Statue of Independence above the city. From there, you can look down across the Rio Grande Valley and you can see the city's two areas easily.

You shouldn't leave Humahuaca without visiting its shops. There you can buy bags, clothes, and nice things for the home – and all at good prices!
