

Likely

If something is **likely**, it will /won't probably happen.

One of the uses of likely is this :

Subject	Verb TO BE	Likely	Infinitive
John	Is	Likely	To come to the party
We	are	Likely	To win

Look at these examples of the use of Likely.

- 1) Please remind me about it. I will probably forget.
Please remind me about it. I am likely to forget.
- 2) Will it probably rain ?
Is it likely to rain ?
- 3) The Queen will probably come up to you and ask a simple question.
The Queen is likely to come up to you and ask a simple question.
