

THERE IS / THERE ARE

Hay : There is $\begin{cases} a \\ an \end{cases}$ (1 sola cosa)

No hay : There isn't $\begin{cases} a \\ an \end{cases}$

Hay.....? : Is there $\begin{cases} a \\ an \end{cases}$? $\begin{cases} \text{Yes, there is. (SÍ, lo hay)} \\ \text{No, there isn't. (No, no lo hay)} \end{cases}$



Hay : There are some (2 cosas o más)

No hay : There aren't any

Hay.....? : Are there any...? $\begin{cases} \text{Yes, there are. (SÍ, los hay)} \\ \text{No, there aren't. (No, no los hay)} \end{cases}$

a, an: uno, una

some: "algo, algunos/as" en frases afirmativas

any: "algo, algunos/as" en frases negativas e interrogativas



Examples:

- + There are some onions. (Hay algunas cebollas.)
- + There aren't any carrots. (No hay zanahorias.)
- + Are there any peppers? Yes, there are. (¿Hay algunos pimientos? Sí, los hay.)
- + There is an ant. (Hay una hormiga.)
- + There isn't a centipede. (No hay un ciempiés.)
- + Is there a cricket? No, there isn't. (¿Hay un grillo? No, no lo hay.)

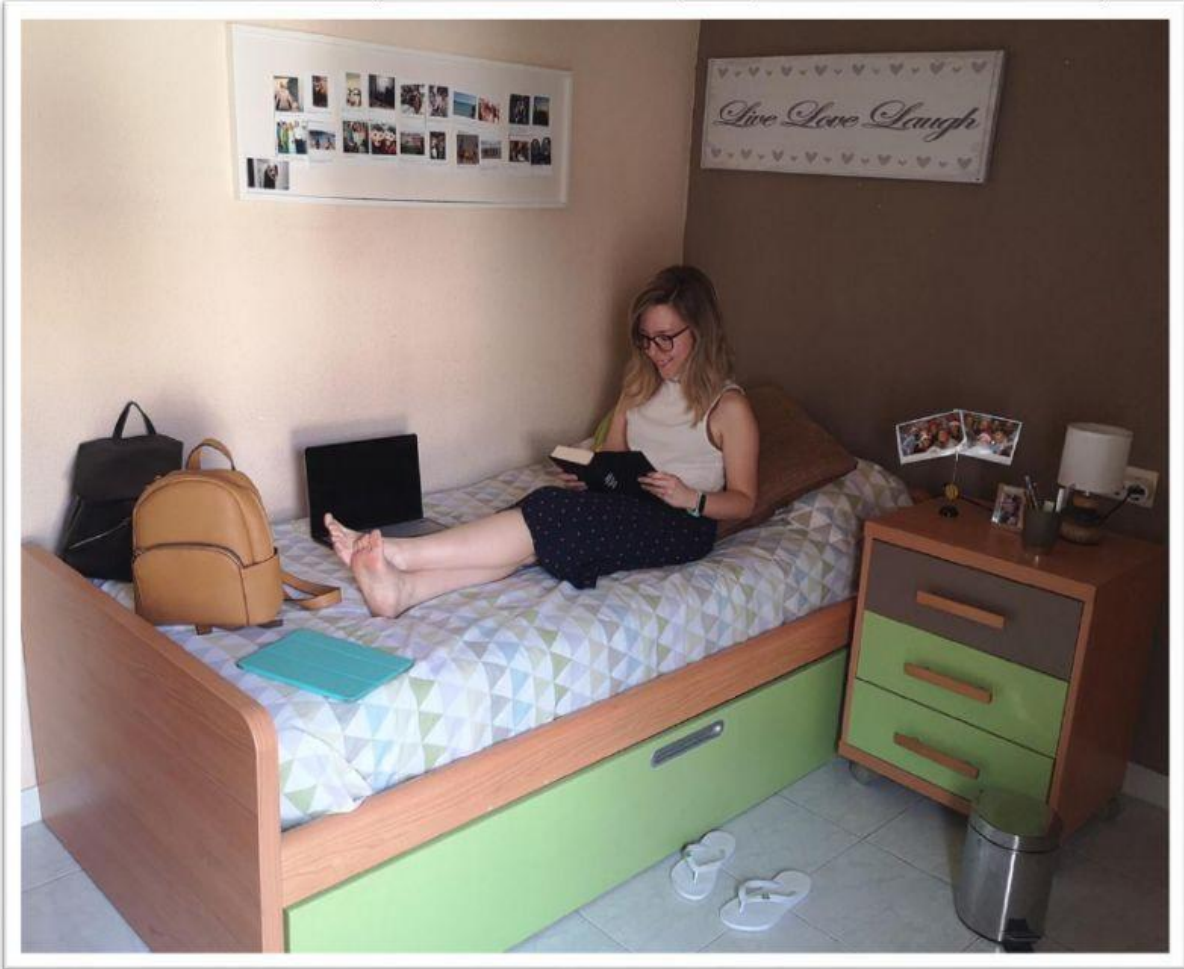
