I/You/We/They **play** tennis.

He/She/It **plays** tennis.

Negative

I/You/We/They **don't play** tennis.

He/She/It **doesn't play** tennis.

Questions

Do I/you/we/they **play** tennis?

Short answers

Yes, I/you/we/they **do**.

No, I/you/we/they **don't**.

Does he/she/it **play** tennis?

Yes, he/she/it **does**.

No, he/she/it **doesn't**.
