Understanding a Sandwich Recipe

Recipes are written in the IMPERATIVE FORM.

In the IMPERATIVE FORM, the subject is INVISIBLE.

The VERB is in the SIMPLE form. There is NO -s.

A sentence in a recipe has FOUR parts.

1. SEQUENCE 2. VERB

3. OBJECT 4.

MANNER or DIRECTION

WORD

The SEQUENCE WORDS are FIRST, NEXT, THEN, AFTER THAT, and FINALLY.


FETA CUCUMBER SANDWICH

- 6 tablespoons of feta cheese
- 5 leaves of fresh mint
- 1 teaspoon of milk
- 1 pita bread
- 2 Lebanese cucumbers
- 2 leaves of lettuce
- 1) In advance, take the feta cheese out of the refrigerator.
- 2) First, cut the mint into very small pieces.
- 3) Then, mix the feta cheese, the mint, and the milk in a bowl.
- 4) Next, slice the cucumber very thin.
- 5) Then, cut the pita completely in half.
- 6) Next, wash and dry the lettuce.
- 7) After that, place one leaf of lettuce on each half of the pita.
- 8) Then, spread the feta cheese mixture on the two leaves of lettuce.
- Finally, arrange the cucumber pieces on top.
