



THE INUIT



Inuit are the indigenous people of the Arctic. They live in Greenland, but also in Alaska, Canada and Russia. For centuries, the Inuit used their ingenuity and strength to survive in a harsh environment.

The Inuit live in cold environment and in the hardest conditions. Inuit are hunters, they hunt walrus, seal, fish, caribou, polar bears. They hunt with bows, arrows, harpoons... They still use old techniques.

In April they hunt whales. In summer they hunt caribou and fishing. They used every part of an animal. they turned skins into clothing, bones into harpoons.

The Inuit diet is based on meat and fish, they also collect roots, berries and seaweed, but there are not too many options to cultivate fruits and vegetables in Greenland because the weather is extremely cold.

Their clothing was made from animals skins and furs. Traditionally, Inuit women made the clothes with seal and caribou skins. Today, they buy the clothes in a shop. But some of them still make traditional clothes.

The most common thing associated to Inuit is an igloo. Igloo means a house. The igloo could be made of wood, peat. Now, they live in houses made of wood, stone and cement.

The Inuit used sleds pulled by dogs, but in modern times they replaced them by snowmobiles, or speedboats, and motorized canoes.

Inuit lived for centuries adapted to the nature, respecting the environment and doing sustainable hunting and fishing.
