- Mum: OK, but there isn't **much** space in my suitcase and I want to put **a few** books in it. Now come on! There's **a lot of** traffic near the airport at this time of day.
- Emma: Wait! Where's my MP3 player?
- Mum: It's here, in your rucksack. Come on. It's time to go!



Luggage is **uncountable**. Don't say "I have ~~2 luggages~~". Say "I've got **two pieces of** luggage : A suitcase and a rucksack "
