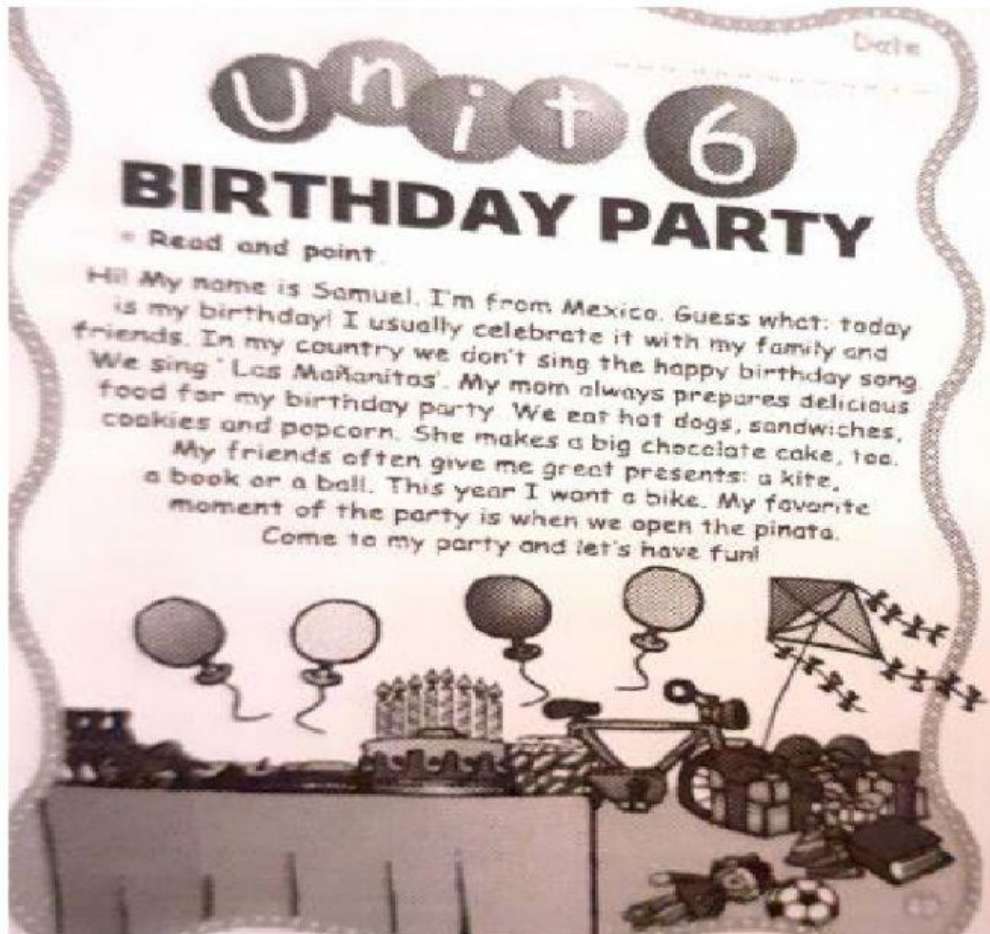

*** Read carefully**
We use the Present Continuous to express an action happening **now**.
I **am** reading the text. | She **is** talking on the phone. | You **are** eating a sandwich.

Affirmative form
I **am**
he/she/it **is**
we/you/they **are** **- ing**

Negative form
I **am not**
he/she/it **isn't**
we/you/they **aren't** **- ing**

Interrogative form
Am I?
Is he/she/it?
Are we/you/they? **- ing?**

Short answers:
I **am**
Yes, he/she/it **is**
we/you/they **are**
I **am not**
No, he/she/it **isn't**
we/you/they **aren't**

Spelling rules for -ing
Add -ing to most verbs.
ask — asking
sleep — sleeping
When the verb ends in e, we eliminate the e and add -ing.
dance — dancing
close — closing
Some verbs double the last consonant before -ing.
sit — sitting
cut — cutting
run — running
swim — swimming
shop — shopping
chat — chatting

This is important!
We usually use special words and phrases with Present Continuous.
• Today
• Now
• At the moment

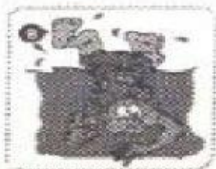

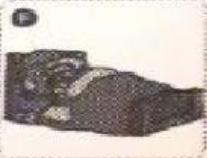
