IS IT A BIG MISTAKE TO USE A WRONG COLLOCATION?



It would sound strange if someone said, "huge rain" "large decision" "finish a habit" or "do a mistake." Most people would understand the meaning, but native English speakers would never combine words in that way. **There is no grammatical reason why.** And that sometimes makes collocations difficult for English learners. If you don't know, for example, that "big decision" is a collocation, **it is not so easy to guess.**

WHAT IS A COLLOCATION?



A collocation is when two or more words naturally go together and sound correct together. Nice weather is an example of a collocation. We don't say pretty weather in English, even though NICE and PRETTY are synonyms. They are **ARBITRARY** and we need to memorise them, there is no rule...
typical collocation: heavy rain
Not: thick rain
typical collocation: high temperature
Not: tall temperature

MAKE ? DO? TAKE?

Do, make, and take are used in combination with hundreds of words such as: experiment (do an experiment), test (take a test), noise (make a noise) You can find some typical MAKE and DO collocations below.
