

- Read the rules for the regular verbs in the past and complete the chart

Spelling: regular verbs

most verbs: add <i>-ed</i>	<i>play → played</i>
verbs that end in <i>-e</i> : add <i>-d</i>	<i>change → changed</i>
verbs that end in consonant + <i>-y</i> : change <i>-y</i> to <i>-i</i> and add <i>-ed</i>	<i>carry → carried</i>
one-syllable verbs ending in a consonant + a vowel + a consonant (except <i>w, x</i> or <i>y</i>): double the consonant and add <i>-ed</i>	<i>stop → stopped</i>
two-syllable verbs ending in a stressed vowel + a consonant: double the final consonant and add <i>-ed</i>	<i>prefer → preferred</i>
In British English, we double the final <i>l</i> .	<i>travel → travelled</i> (American English: <i>travel → traveled</i>)
