My throat hurts OR I have a sore throat.

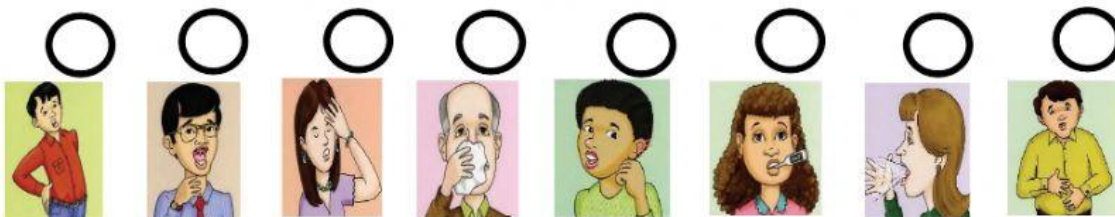

SHOULD: (Debería)

SHOULDN'T: (No Debería)

WE USE 'SHOULD or SHOULDN'T' FOR ADVICE: (should/shouldn't + Infinitive verb)

A: I have a toothache. My tooth hurts.

B: You should go to your dentist.

A: I have an exam tomorrow.

B: You should study tonight.

A: I have a stomachache.

B: You shouldn't drink cola. It's bad for your stomach.
