

Reported speech (2 - changes in verbs)

We use reported speech to tell others what someone said.

To do this, we use **reporting verbs**. We can use different verbs depending on sentences:

- statements: say, tell, explain, announce, add, promise, complain...
- questions: ask, wonder, enquire, want to know...
- orders: tell, instruct, warn, remind, order...
- requests: ask, beg...
- offers & suggestions: offer, suggest, propose, advise, recommend...
