The Articles

The **articles** belong to the class of words called <u>determiners</u>. The words **a**, **an** and **the** are the articles



GRAMMAR HELP

The e in the has a short sound before words beginning with a consonant, like the words below:

the carpet the dentist the television the road the sitting room the sofa

When you use the before a word beginning with a vowel, it has a different sound. You say it with a long e, like the sound in me or bee or tea:

> the umbrella the apple the orang-utan the igloo

the exit the ugly duckling

The word university starts with a sound like the consonant y, so the e in the is short before university:

Mum teaches at the university.

The word one starts with a w sound, so the e in the is short before one:

Is this the one you wanted?

The word **the** is called the **definite article**. You use **the** before a <u>noun</u> when you are talking about something or someone definite, and people know which thing or person you mean.

The telephone is ringing.

Where is the cat?

I think she's under the bed.

I have to go to the dentist today.

Helen is laying the table.
