



SECOND CONDITIONAL

REMEMBER!!

Conditional sentences have two parts: an **'if clause'** and a **'result'** clause.

The **'if clause'** is the part that describes the hypothetical situation that we want to speak about - "*If I had 10 million euros,...*"

The **'result clause'** is the part that explains what results may come from the hypothetical 'if clause' actually happening - "*..., I would buy a Ferrari.*"



2ND CONDITIONAL IMPROBABLE TO IMPOSSIBLE

The Second Conditional is used to hypothesize about situations that we feel are improbable or even impossible.

We use this particular conditional a lot when we dream about having something that we don't actually have, or being someone or something that we are not.

It can vary in use from something that we feel is unlikely all the way to something that we feel is practically impossible.



STRUCTURE & EXAMPLES

Structure: *If + Past, Subject + would/could/might + Infinitive (-to)*

Remember, we can change the order and put the result clause first. The only difference is that the comma is no longer needed. We use **'would'** when we feel **certain** about the result, **'could'** when we think it's a **possible** result, and **'might'** when we think it's a **probable** result

- *If I had more time, I would study Japanese. (certain)*
- *If they were here, they could help us move the furniture. (possible)*
- *She might be angry too if she knew what happened. (probable)*
- *What would you do if you won the lottery? (general for questions)*
- *If they weren't so messy, it wouldn't be a problem*
- *Everyone would be happy if there were no taxes to pay*
