

Type 1 Conditional Sentences

(A) Type 1 conditionals are used to talk about something that is always true or always happens.

If- clause (simple present tense) ↓ If you <u>grow</u> more bamboos,	Main-clause (will + verb) ↙ ↘ giant pandas <u>will have</u> more food.
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(B) You can change the order of the two clauses. The meaning is the same. We do not use a comma when the main clause comes first.

Main- clause (will + verb) ↙ ↘ Giant pandas <u>will have</u> more food	If-clause (simple present tense) ↓ if we <u>grow</u> more bamboos.
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● Note : The negative form of **will not** = **won't**
