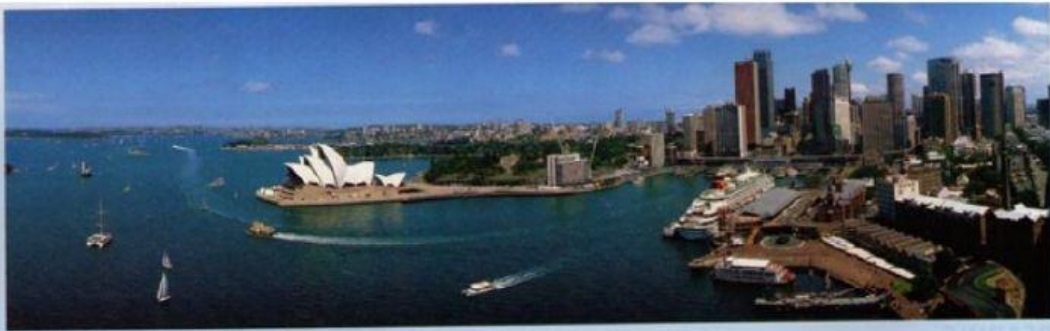


1. Read the text about the trip of two teenagers

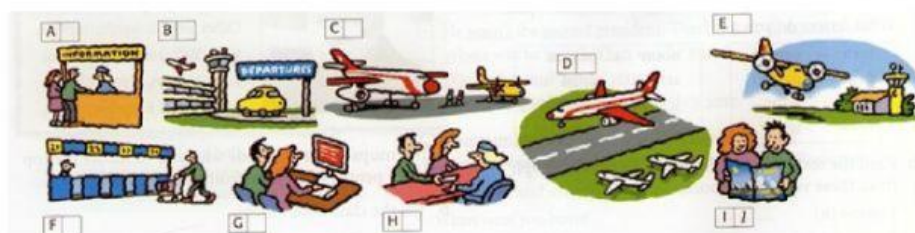
She looked at our tickets. "The next flight? This is the end of your trip. Where **did you want** to go?"
