

Past Continuous

The past continuous is used to talk about activity or action that had been being carried out by someone. It is a finished action, but it had its time lapse in the past

STRUCTURE:

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
Pronoun + was/were + verb ing + complement.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Pronoun + was/were + not + verb ing + complement.• Pronoun + wasn't/weren't + verb ing + complement.	Was/were + pronoun + complement + ?

Example:

Affirmative: My sister was preparing the lunch.

Negative: She wasn't running, she was walking.

Interrogative: Were you sleeping? No, I was thinking.
