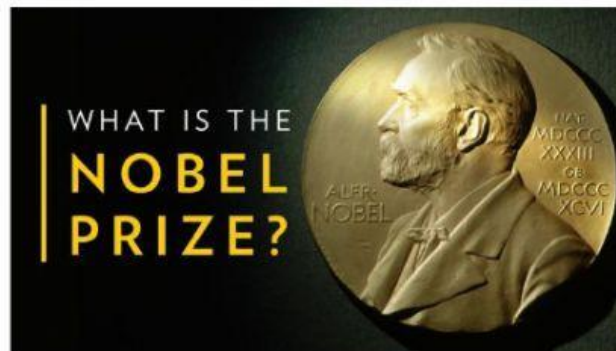


THE NOBEL PRIZE

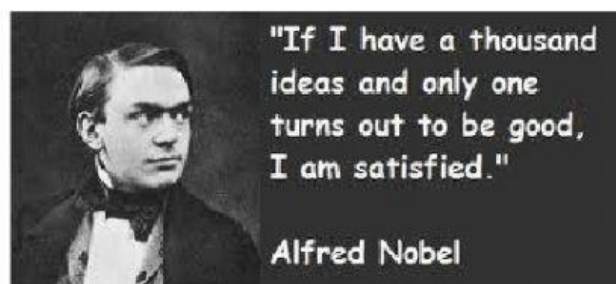

One of the most admired and respected awards in the world is the Nobel Prize, and receiving one is not easy. The Nobel Prize Foundation gives awards to people for intellectual achievements, like those who have conducted some awesome research, made an important discovery or even tried to bring peace to the world.

Since 1901, the year the prizes were first awarded, the Nobel organization has given out more than 800 prizes. Nobel prizes are given out in six areas: medicine, physics, chemistry, literature, peace, and economics.

If you win a Nobel Prize, you get a beautiful gold medal and Nobel Prize winners also receive a large amount of money, around one million dollars each!



The Nobel Prize is the legacy of Alfred Nobel, a chemist, engineer, inventor and entrepreneur. Before he passed away in 1896, he said he wanted his money to be used for awards given in his name. An organization called the Nobel Foundation was set up in order to make this happen. The first Nobel Prizes were awarded in 1901 and they are still being awarded today. However, there are some years when the Nobel Prizes have not been awarded, most of them during World War I and II.

The Nobel Prize award ceremonies are held on 10 December, the anniversary of Alfred Nobel's death, in the Swedish capital of Stockholm and the Norwegian capital of Oslo.

NOBEL PRIZE WINNERS FROM SPAIN

Spain, with eight Nobel Prizes, occupies the 22nd place in the global ranking. Six of them have won the Nobel Prize for Literature: José Echegaray (1904), Jacinto Benavente (1922), Juan Ramón Jiménez (1956), Vicente Aleixandre (1977), Camilo José Cela (1989) and the writer Peruvian -and also with Spanish nationality since 1993- Mario Vargas Llosa. The other two received the Nobel Prize in Medicine: Santiago Ramón y Cajal (1906) and Severo Ochoa (1959).
