

## MODAL VERBS

<b>CAN (has two forms)</b>	<b>MUST</b>	<b>SHOULD</b>
<p>CAN for the present simple COULD for the past simple. CAN expresses ability or capability, possibility, incredulity or doubt.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>I can swim very well</i></li><li>• <i>I could not (couldn't) go to the theater yesterday</i></li><li>• <i>Can you speak English?</i></li></ul>	<p>MUST expresses obligation, necessity, supposition and prohibition.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>She must be waiting for her friend.</i></li><li>• <i>You must not (mustn't) speak out loud!</i></li><li>• <i>Must they come to the school?</i></li></ul>	<p>SHOULD expresses advice.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>You should go to the doctor.</i></li><li>• <i>She shouldn't forget her birthday.</i></li><li>• <i>Should I stay here?</i></li></ul>
