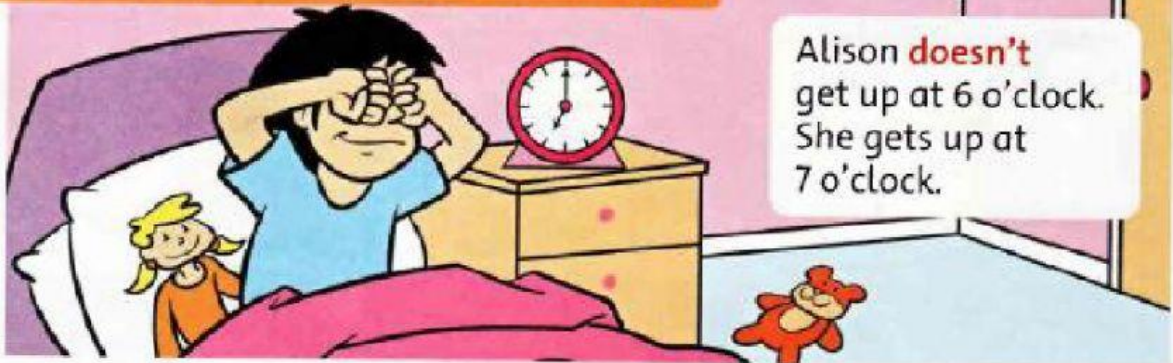




He doesn't get up at...

The present simple negative (he doesn't go)



We use the present simple negative to talk about things we do not usually do. With **he**, **she** and **it** we use **doesn't** and the verb.

*He **doesn't** go to school.*
*She **doesn't** have breakfast.*
*It **doesn't** go to bed.*

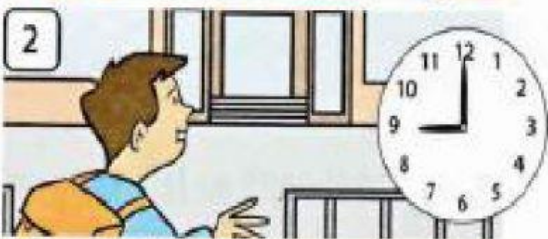
doesn't = does not
