LET

Subject + LET + Person + Verb

Meaning

to allow someone to do something

Example

Henry let me drive his new car.



MAKE

Subject + MAKE + Person + Verb

Meaning

to force or require someone to take an action

Example

My parents always make me do my homework before I go out.
