Grammar

Express finished time

E.g. We lived in Japan from 1995 to 1998.

Refer to definite time

E.g. I saw the Eiffel Tower in 2007.

Indicate series of finished actions

E.g. First he read the book, and then he watched the movie.

Describe unfinished time

E.g. I've worked as a teacher since 2011.

Refer to indefinite time

E.g. I have seen the Eiffel Tower.

Express experience or result

E.g. She has already watched this movie 3 times.

2da column

PAST SIMPLE

Specific times in the past

yesterday, five minutes ago, in 2000, the other day, last month

Examples:

I went to the park yesterday.
I studied in China in 2010.

3rd Column

PRESENT PERFECT

Vague times in the past

ever/never, not yet, already, so far, to date, till now, up to the present

Examples:

I've never gone to the park.
I haven't been to China yet.When **DID** you
go/see/visit?**Have** you ever
gone/seen/visited?**SUBJECT :** Present Perfect Tense**A) Write a suitable sentence using the PRESENT PERFECT TENSE :**

- Ann's hair was dirty. Now it's clean. (wash) Ann has washed her hair
- Tom was 80 kg. Now he's 70. (lose weight)
- Bill played football yesterday. Now he can't walk; his leg is in plaster. (break)
- Mysister is looking for her pen. (lose)
- Mary is on holiday in France. (go)
- Mr. Hill was in Canada last week. He's back in London now. (be)
- Look! Mrs. Smith has got a lot of packages. (buy)
- I can't eat anything now. (eat too much)
- Mrs. Jenkins is very tired. (clean / house)
- Tony needs a holiday. (work / hard / this year)

B) Use PRESENT PERFECT TENSE after BECAUSE:**Example:** She can't go to the party (catch a cold)She can't go to the party because she has caught a cold.

- He can't walk very fast. (hurt / leg)
- I can't get in. (lose / key)
- I know this story very well. (see the film)
- I can't post the letter. (not put / stamp / on it)
- He can't stand up. (eat too much)
- They can't go on holiday. (not save / money)
- I know him. (meet him before)
- We don't know how he is. (not hear from him)
- He won't take a cigarette. (give up smoking)
- She can't get in. (he / lock the door)
