## A generation of couch potatoes



Lots of teenagers have posters of their sports hero on (1)\_\_\_\_\_ bedroom wall. But do they follow the healthy examples set by these athletes? British parents are worried that young people are not as fit and healthy as in the past. Why is this?

According to the British Heart Foundation, 13 to 15-year-olds are spending too much time doing sedentary activities such as watching TV or playing computer games. A special report describes a generation of couch potatoes, young people sitting around at home, growing up in their bedrooms, travelling by car and in serious danger of heart disease as (2)\_\_\_\_\_ get older.
