Imagine you did not understand the underlined words.
Ask a question to hear that part again (the answer to your question must be the underlined part of the sentence):

1. We are reading a book about computers.
2. The teacher was copying the questions on the board.
3. Johnny's read the text.
4. They were drawing the horse using a computer.
5. We are studying because we have an exam tomorrow.
6. I was making three sandwiches.
7. We're buying three bottles of wine. (Not "three bottles", so the question is not "How many bottles...?")
8. I'm getting up at half-past seven this week.
9. I'm going on holiday in July.
10. He's driving his mother's car. (Do not start with Which...?, because what you want to know is who owns the car.)
