Useful Tip > Grammar

We use **to + verb** to connect ideas.

I want to have a date. My parents say I'm too young. = My parents say I'm too young to have a date. (purpose)

We use **want** to express wishes.

Want + to + verb: *I want to have a bigger room. / She doesn't want to do the housework. / What do you want to do?*

Want + a noun: *I really want a bigger room for myself. / She doesn't want a big party.*

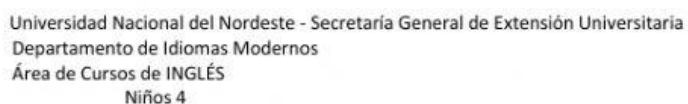
