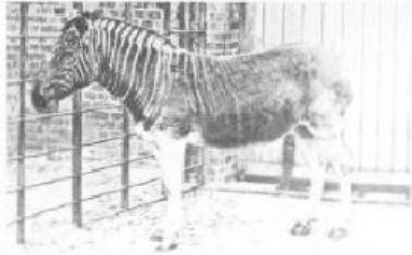

Quagga



Tyrannosaurus Rex

Tyrannosaurus Rex was one of the largest dinosaurs of all time. It was up to 14 metres long and 5.5 metres tall. It walked on two legs, and had a very big head and a heavy tail so it didn't fall over. It became extinct about 65 million years ago.

Quagga

The Quagga looked like it was half horse and half zebra. The last wild Quagga was shot in the late 1870s, and the last animal died on 12 August 1883 at the Artis Magistra Zoo in Amsterdam. The front of its body had stripes and the back of its body was plain brown. It ate grass and leaves.

Thylacine

The Thylacine looked like a big, short-haired dog. At the back of its body it had 13 to 21 stripes which is why it was called the Tasmanian tiger. Its stripes were brown. It was between 1 and 2 metres long. It had a big mouth and 46 teeth. It only ate meat and liked eating kangaroos and birds. The last one died in the 1940s.
