


## Comparative Adjectives

Short words (1 syllable) → -er

old → older slow → slower  
warm → warmer tall → taller

big → bigger, hot → hotter  
heavy → heavier, happy → happier

Long words (2, 3, 4 syllables) → more...

dangerous → more dangerous  
expensive → more expensive  
Irregular comparative forms:  
good → better, far → further  
bad → worse, little → less
