Affirmative

	Full form / short form
I	am / 'm playing
You	are / 're playing
He / She / It	is / 's playing
We / You / They	are / 're playing

Spelling variations

1 For most verbs we add *-ing* to the base form.

play + *-ing* = playing

walk + *-ing* = walking

2 However, there are some spelling variations:

- verbs ending in *-e*. Drop the *-e* and add *-ing*.

have → having

- short verbs ending in a vowel plus a consonant. Double the final consonant and add *-ing*.

sit → sitting

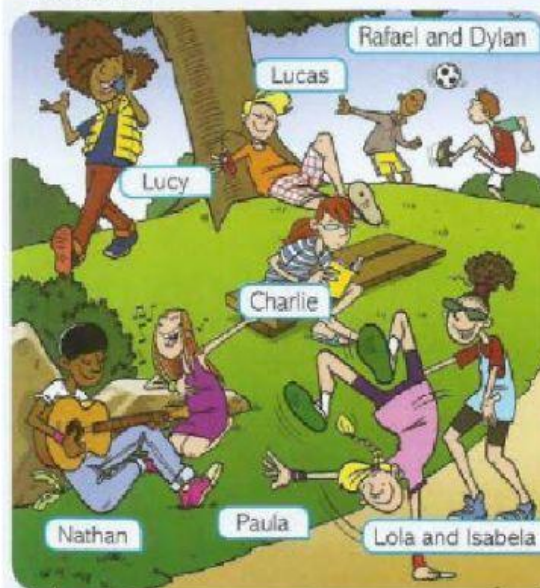
