Part of Speech	<u>Examples</u>	<u>Definition</u>
1. noun	cat, teacher, hospital, idea	a word for a person, place, or thing
2. pronoun	I, you, we, me, she, them	a word that replaces a noun
3. verb	run, sleep, like, have	a word for an action or state of being
4. adjective	big, slow, beautiful	a word that describes a noun or pronoun
5. adverb	slowly, loudly, often, very	a word that describes a verb, adjective, or adverb (It tells where/when/how/how much/how often)
6. conjunction	and, but, so, because	a word that connects words or groups of words
7. preposition	of, at, in, for	a word that shows the relationship between a noun or pronoun and other words
8. interjection	Wow! Oh! Really?!	a word that shows surprise or strong feeling
9.determiner	a, an, the, my, this, that	a word that comes before a noun and tells which thing you are talking about
