A brilliant moonbeam was slanting through a gap in the curtains. It was shining right on to her pillow.

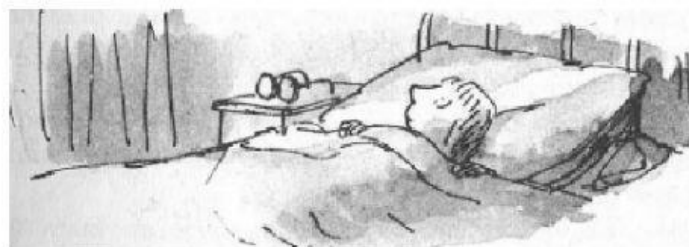
The other children in the dormitory had been asleep for hours.
