

## TOO

We use TOO to express that something is excessive. It has a negative meaning.

-too + adjective:

This T-shirt is **too small** for me.  
I can't wear it!

## NOT... ENOUGH

We use NOT... ENOUGH to express that something is insufficient. It has a negative meaning.

-not + adjective + enough:

This T-shirt is **not big enough** for me. I can't wear it!

## (NOT) AS... AS

We use (NOT) AS... AS to express that something has the same or different qualities with another thing.

-as + adjective + as:

The blue T-shirt is **as big as** the red T-shirt.

-not as + adjective + as:

The green T-shirt is **not as big as** the blue T-shirt.
